

From the President

bike riding along our historic streets, getting our houses ready for exterior repairs and house painting.

As I anticipated in January's column, there was a major push by the Administration of Lawrence Public Schools USD 497 to close both New York Elementary and Liberty Memorial Central Middle Schools, along with three other elementary schools, all east of Maine Street. Community reaction was swift and powerful. On Valentine's Day, the Board of Education took school closures off the table, for this year. We still expect our East Lawrence schools could be back on the chopping block again next year. ELNA worked collaboratively with the New York Elementary Site Council and with Save Our Schools 497 to support our neighborhood schools. Both entities plan to spend the next year working on ideas to streamline school district operations and to ensure that New York and Liberty Memorial Central will continue to play a vital role in educating Lawrence students well into the future. ELNA will remain very active in these efforts. ELNA sincerely appreciates several School Board members who gave of their time to meet with us and the Site Council, and actively listened to our concerns. Active community engagement leads to the best community decisions!

As always, ELNA remains vigilant in monitoring development activities in and around the neighborhood. Currently, we are watching a rezoning proposal for a commercial use of the Quonset Hut at Eighth and Pennsylvania, and a development proposal for the New Hampshire Lofts on the east side of the 1000 block of New Hampshire, in the environs of several designated historic buildings. It does not escape our notice that the municipality has granted a lot of "incentives" for the development of affordable housing geared for seniors, singles and couples, but not much for housing for families with school age children. Housing for families could really help raise the census of children for our neighborhood schools. ELNA will be taking a more active role in advocating for more balanced housing policies in the coming year.

To assist our efforts to support school equity, appropriate development, traffic safety, and our many other priorities, ELNA needs money. Fortunately, that has recently become easier. ELNA just received approval from the IRS as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. This means that donations to ELNA are now tax-deductible for the donor, and we can now seek grants from foundations that are limited to supporting 501 (c)(3) organizations. This is huge good news! If you donated to ELNA after June 15, 2021, your contribution is tax deductible!

New York Elementary

How can you support New York Elementary? Here's a note from our school Parent Involvement Facilitator with ideas of a few simple ways.

Our teachers have been stretched and pulled in multiple directions since the onset of COVID. While our elementary schools are off the closure chopping block, deep budget cuts will likely affect staff and schools. As such, honoring our staff's real struggles is a priority. We are working to keep our teacher's lounge stocked with cheese sticks, yogurt, fruit, grab and go snacks and sodas a token of our support.

Often times, our students arrive at school in clothing that is ill fitting, or not appropriate for the weather. We are in constant need of leggings of all sizes for girls and joggers of all sizes for the boys. Our t-shirt stashes are bulging, however the need for leggings and joggers is consistent.

ELNA has a Traffic Safety Committee!

ELNA has formed a new traffic safety committee. Our group has met twice already, and we are initially looking at two problem areas, Delaware Street from 8th to 11th street and the intersection at 8th and Connecticut. Our goal is to improve traffic safety in these areas by understanding traffic best practices that help ensure the flow of pedestrians, bicycles and automobiles. We chose these two areas because neighbors have noticed a high number of accidents occurring at 8th and Connecticut. and these blocks of Delaware Street are a potential problem spot because of the completion of the Lawrence Loop and the rerouting of Lawrence Transit Route 1. This will generate more self propelled traffic along this designated truck route. There is also neighborhood pedestrian traffic that crosses Delaware to access Hobbs Park.

Brook Creek NA recommended we apply for a CDBG infrastructure grant, which we have done. A couple years ago Brook Creek got a grant to put 20 mph pavement markers onto a few of their streets to reinforce their newly designated speed limits on some of their streets. We have applied for a grant to put similar decals on Delaware street to reinforce the 20 mph designation there. Hopefully this is a first step to making our neighborhood a little bit safer for all who walk, ride and drive here. Come help us have an impact. 

Watkins Exhibit

Confronting the Past:

The Douglas County Community Remembrance Project Watkins Museum of History

In 1882, a violent mob carried out a lynching that ultimately caused the deaths of four African American Lawrence residents. For years, the story of their deaths remained a quiet burden on the community, remembered among the Black citizens of Lawrence but largely forgotten in the telling of the city's history.

The Douglas County Community Remembrance Project, a group of organizations working to install a marker near the site of the lynching, held a soil collection ceremony in fall 2021. The event served as an opportunity for the public to mourn and created a tangible remembrance of the lynching's victims through the collected soil.

Soil for each victim is now part of the Watkins' permanent collection. From February to August, the Watkins will partner with the Community Remembrance Project to host an exhibit on the 1882 lynching and remembrance efforts.

The Watkins Museum, located at 1047 Mass St, is open 10am to 4pm Tuesday through Saturday.

COVID-19 Procedures

Face masks are required at all times while interacting with staff or other customers.

Customers must maintain six feet of social distance with staff and other customers.

Staff reserves the right to limit the number of customers inside the facility to maintain proper social distancing.

Customers should follow the CDC's recommendations for Protecting Yourself & Others.

Compost Facility Guidelines

Customers must bring their own tools (e.g., shovels, pitchforks) to load and unload.

Personal motorized loading equipment (e.g., skid steer) is not allowed.

Gates to the facility will close promptly at 2 p.m. All customers must be out of the facility by closing time.

Do NOT stop on the railroad tracks while waiting to enter the facility.

All transactions are CASH ONLY. Please bring exact change.

Absolutely no bills larger than \$20 will be accepted.

Yard Waste Drop-Off

Absolutely no plastic bags

Brush must not be longer than 4 feet

Brush must not be more than 8 inches in diameter

Brush must be loose, no ties of any kind

Leaves and grass may be loose, or in kraft paper bags only

Materials Not Accepted

Lumber

Pallets

Sod

Stones

Rope

Fill Dirt

Food Waste (Including food grown in the garden)

Metal

Plastic

Tree Root Balls

Compost & Woodchips Pick Up

The City offers compost and woodchips to Lawrence residents at the Compost Facility. Compost and woodchips are not intended for commercial applications.

Self-loaded compost and woodchips cost \$10 per truckload. Small quantities of less than or equal to 20 gallon are free.

2022 Compost & Woodchip City-Load Events

The City offers City-load days at the Compost Facility once a month (unless noted) during peak season to allow customers to have compost and/or mulch loaded into their trucks or trailers by City staff using loading equipment. All compost facility guidelines are still in effect during City-load events.

Cost: Compost and wood chips loaded into trucks or trailers by City staff using loading equipment costs \$10 per scoop. One scoop typically fills a pickup truck bed. There is a limit of three scoops per visit.

Other Information

Compost

Compost consists of decayed organic matter and has been proven to be extremely successful as a natural soil amendment. Lawrence Community Compost is made from the yard trimmings and small woody debris collected curbside, as well as grass clippings, leaves, and woody debris from some commercial lawn care providers.

Woodchips

The woodchips the City sells are made from tree materials brought in from residential and commercial sources. Woodchips are used as a garden mulch and are beneficial for weed suppression and water retention. They can also be used to limit or prevent soil erosion.

Also from Iowa St: Go West on 21st St., Left on Constant Ave. Turn South on Crestline to the roundabout, enter Lot 301 to your East.


Event Safety Protocols:

Emergency & Furnace Loans

For emergency situations, the City of Lawrence offers an emergency loan program that can provide up to \$5,000 for emergency repairs or furnace replacement.

Eligibility requirements include:

The property must be located within Lawrence City Limits and not within a designated flood plain areas.

The property must be owner-occupied and contain no more than two dwelling units. The applicant must be the owner/occupant of the property for a minimum of one year prior to application and payment of ad valorem taxes must be current. The applicant must be current on all mortgage payments.

The applicant and/or structure for which the application is being made cannot have received comprehensive rehabilitation from the City since December 31, 1978.

The structure for which the application is being made can receive only one emergency loan and one furnace loan assistance from the City.

Applicants gross family income from all sources may not exceed 80% of median income.

Income guidelines for families at 80% of median income are as follows: family of 1 not to exceed \$47,350, family of 2 not to exceed \$54, 100, family of 3 not to exceed \$60,000, etc.
