On February 12th, the City Commission accepted a recommendation from the Lawrence Cultural



Arts Commission to designate the downtown and east Lawrence areas a "cultural district". This district idea was led by the Lawrence Arts Center and received support from several area organizations, businesses, and individuals. In essence, it is an attempt to tie together the many important cultural, historic, and artistic resources in the area in a meaningful way. To work through the details of the district, the city has authorized the creation of a seven member task force.

ELNA board members and other residents have been debating the district for several months now and ultimately our board voted to support the district formation. We successfully lobbied for language in the proposal meant to support our residents and 2 of the 7 task force members will be appointed by ELNA. Please bring concerns, questions, and ideas to our attention! I anticipate that all of our monthly meetings will touch on this subject for the foreseeable future.

Elections are coming up! The city commission has a large list of candidates so this election is getting a lot of attention. There are also school board elections and a proposed bond for school improvements. The bond aims to bring improvements to all of the schools in the district but focuses on 6 elementary schools, New York included. VOTE! VOTE! VOTE April 2nd! The higher the voter turnout from our neighborhood, the stronger the voice we have with our elected officials.

As the newly elected ELNA president I'd like to thank Leslie Soden for all of her presidential efforts. She did a tremendous job representing the neighborhood and gave a lot of herself to the job. I also want to give special thanks to Aaron Paden, the new ELNA vice president. Aaron has really stepped up and the two of us are partnering on many topics so that we can manage our families, work, AND ELNA. Think of him as a co-president because I literally could not be doing this without him!


What do you love about East Lawrence? EVERY-THING!

East Lawrence Votes!

Lawrence City and School General Elections will be held April 2nd, 2013. Items up for vote include Lawrence City Commission, Lawrence School Board, and the much discussed No-Tax-Increase School Bond Issue.

Historically, East Lawrence has very low voter turn out. In the major election last November, only a little more than half of all registered voters turned out. Estimates show too that not all eligible residents are even registered.

That's easy to fix. Register! To vote in the Lawrence City and School General Elections on April 2nd, you must be registered by March 12th. To register you must be a U.S. citizen and a resident of the state of Kansas, have reached the age of 18 years before the election, and not imprisoned, or paroled. You can find an application to register at the Douglas County Clerk's office, 1100 Massachusetts St., Level 1, or at the state of Kansas website https://www.kdor.org/voterregistration/Default.aspx. Once your registration has been processed, the county clerk's office will mail you a registration card with your precinct and voting place on the card.

FYI, parts of East Lawrence falls into precincts 33, 35, 39, and 40. Voting places for these precincts are Liberty Memorial Central Middle School, the East Lawrence Rec Center, New York Elementary, and Trinity Lutheran Church.

Next, Vote! Once you are registered and you know where to vote, do it!

All polling places are open 7am to 7pm, making it easy to fit your civic duty into your day. You can even bring your

children if you must, so don't let that be an obstacle. Consider it a teaching moment, and show your children how important voting is!

Because of new state legislation in January, you must also be sure to bring a valid, government issued photo ID with you. Some valid ID documents are: driver's license or nondriver's ID card issued by Kansas or another state, U.S. passport, concealed carry of handgun license issued by Kansas or another state (yes, really,) U.S. military ID, employee badge or ID document issued by a government office, student ID issued by an accredited Kansas postsecondary educational institution, or public assistance ID card issued by a government office. If you do not have a government issued ID card, you can get one at the County Clerk's office. They can create for you a photo ID valid for voting purposes. Contact the Clerk's office at 832-5167 for more information.

Does voting on April 2nd still sound like too much trouble? Vote by advance ballot. You can download an advance ballot from the Kansas Secretary of State's office at http://www.sos.ks.gov/. Advance voting begins March 16th.

The results of this Spring General Election directly affect the quality of life in your community. It's important. Register. Vote. Make your opinion heard. Show the city that East Lawrence votes!

Represent the East Side on an Advisory Committee

Besides voting on April 2nd, you can positively impact your community by volunteering to serve on a city advisory board.

These boards/ task forces investigate, deliberate, and directly report to the City of Lawrence on specific issues in the Lawrence community.

Some current vacancies include:

150th Anniversary Advisory Committee A new committee, the 150th Anniversary Advisory Committee will have nine members and is tasked with advising the City Commission on the implementation of the 150th Anniversary schedule of events and to recognize the 150th Anniversary of the August 21, 1863 raid on the City of Lawrence by Quantrill and his followers.

Community Development Advisory Committee (formerly Neighborhood Resources Advisory Committee) This board's function is to develop and propose Neighborhood Resources strategy and policy, to recommend allocation of CDGB and HOME funds, and to review Housing Code and Environmental Code appeals. One vacancy for a position that expired 09/30/12.

Downtown Task Force The Downtown Task Force shall develop recommendations to the governing body of the City of Lawrence regarding the City's downtown, specifically focused on retail vacancies and retail growth management, mix of retail and bar uses in the downtown area, event coordination with Convention and Visitors Bureau and the University of Kansas, and Support for the Arts in the downtown area.

Among the issues the Task Force should specifically review is the feasibility of incentives for retail incubation in the downtown area with the goal of enhancing non-food service retail occupancies in downtown businesses.

A newly formed task force, the Downtown Task Force will hold seven to eleven members.

Human Relations Commission This Commission consists of nine members from diverse racial, ethnic, commercial, industrial, and other segments of the community who work to eliminate discrimination in employment, public accommodations, and housing by accepting, investigating, ruling upon, and resolving complaints within the City limits of Lawrence. Some of the activities include study of the problem of discrimination or any other matter which may have an adverse impact on community relations; promote good will and cooperation among diverse ethnic groups and other elements of the population of Lawrence; solicit, receive, and accept funding for programs and to advise and support the Director and City Commission.

Two vacancies for positions that expired 09/30/12 and one vacancy for a position that expires 09/30/14.

Lawrence Cultural Arts Commission This group is the City's advisory board on all matters of public art. Some ongoing programs include the Outdoor Downtown Sculpture Exhibition and the annual Phoenix Awards. The board also makes recommendations to the City Commission regarding construction or renovation of public buildings, purchase of artwork for the City and sponsorship of local art activities.

Four positions expired 01/31/13 and all are eligible for reappointment to additional terms. One vacancy for a position that expired 01/31/13.

The compost and woodchips are not intended for commercial applications, but rather for the citizens of Lawrence.

Saturday, April 13, 8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. (will close early if supply is depleted)

The city will load by tractor into pick-up trucks and trailers. The city cannot load trucks with ladder racks. Patrons are asked to bring a tarp for their pickup to secure the woodchips, preventing them from littering the roadway as they drive from the facility. The cost of the woodchips will be \$10 per bucket load, which is equivalent to 2 cubic yards. CASH only.
