

Per our bylaws, nominations for ELNA Board positions were taken at our October meeting, and the members can put their seal of approval on the nominees at our November meeting. Unlike that earlier election, we have a good idea who our ELNA Board members will be.

While we are very happy that three new Board members will be joining us, we are not happy that three of our current members will be leaving the Board. We will miss the perspectives and contributions made by the departing Board members, Anna McCoy, Boog Highberger and Suzan Hampton. They all have their reasons for moving on, but Suzan's reason is particularly sad to me. Suzan and her spouse are pursuing their dream of owning and fixing up a single-family home. There was a time when hard-working people could look to East Lawrence as the place to put down roots and build their dreams. This neighborhood is full of such people. Unfortunately, when Suzan and her spouse went looking for their forever home, it was not to be found in East Lawrence, and they moved north of the river. Fortunately, Suzan has not given up on looking for a home in East Lawrence in the future.

We were once the neighborhood with the best affordable housing values in Lawrence, particularly for people willing to roll up their sleeves. Sadly, that is becoming less true. ELNA strives to create a welcoming presence for all who live here or move here, regardless of their background or personal circumstances. We also remain very committed to our 150-year roots and history as a diverse and affordable community. We will do our best to make sure that our newly elected officials are mindful of the importance of maintaining that delicate balance as well.

### **ELNA Board Elections**

Please join us on zoom Monday November 8th from 7-9pm for our Annual Meeting. At this meeting, the ELNA Board and attending membership will vote to accept the slate of candidates for the 2021-2022 Board.

## **Construction Projects**

All around East Lawrence, there are, or will be construction projects, both large and small. Here are several of them that ELNA has been actively monitoring, and participating in or commenting on.

At the top of our list is the Wishing Bench at Ninth and Delaware. The Wishing Bench now sports a new deck, with accessible ramp, and a colorful new roof, thanks to the generosity of two construction companies based in Perry, the NR Hamm Company and Diamond Everley Roofing. With wonderful support from the community, the East Lawrence Neighborhood Association gets things done!

Just to the southeast of the Wishing Bench, work is proceeding in earnest on the multi-use pathway that provides one of the missing links in the Lawrence Loop that encircles most of the city. This segment, from Ninth and Delaware through Hobbs Park will connect with the Burroughs Creek segment that goes through Haskell Indian Nations University, connecting with another new segment to the Wetlands.

Final approvals are in the works for construction of a splash pad at Fifteenth Street and the Burroughs Creek Trail. Lawrence's first splash pad, in the southeastern corner of East Lawrence, will also serve nearby residents of the Brook Creek and Barker neighborhoods, Edgewood Homes, and trail users throughout Lawrence.

Liberty Memorial Central Middle School anchors the southwestern corner of East Lawrence. The charm of LMCMS is that it has an urban campus, whereas other Lawrence middle schools are more suburban. LMCMS does not have acres of parking and long driveways for drop off and pick up of students. Anyone with a student at LMCMS, or who uses Fourteenth Street during certain times of the day, experiences the traffic impacts of this. USD 497 will be reconfiguring the north parking lot off of Fourteenth Street to allow for another 3-5 cars at a time to be on site and off of the street, with no loss of green space. This should help with a difficult traffic flow situation.

Things are happening on both sides of the Santa Fe / AmTrak depot. Work is proceeding again on a new parking lot southeast of the depot. Work stopped several months ago when a historic brick surface was found in the footprint of the new lot. The lot was redesigned to incorporate the brick as part of the surface, and work has re-started. West of the depot, the City is removing and rebuilding part of a new fountain that did not quite turn out as expected. This is the most recent example of what can happen when the city contracts for a project without providing adequate specifications. The brick work along the rebuilt Ninth Street, that will need to be redone correctly, is a more expensive example.

As we reported in the last edition of this newsletter, there will be a major water line replacement going north to south through the heart of East Lawrence. The recommended route appears to be along New Jersey Street from Eighth to Thirteenth Streets, west along Thirteenth, and then south along New York Street to Fifteenth. There will be bore holes every block or two to run the pipe, but fortunately not one big trench along the entire route. This will result in less damage to historic infrastructure and other disruptions. ELNA will provide updated information as it becomes available.

The biggest current construction project in East Lawrence, and one of the biggest ever in the neighborhood, is the Penn Street Lofts, a mixed-use project at 801 Pennsylvania, which is nearing completion. ELNA spent countless hours in meetings and making official public comments regarding size and scale, specific uses, parking and other matters. As often happens with projects of this scale, opinions of neighbors vary widely. Hopefully, no matter where any individual's opinion fits along the spectrum, most can agree that ELNA's vigilant monitoring and input has resulted in a better project.

St. Luke AME Church at Ninth and New York has been a significant cultural institution in East Lawrence since 1910. It is one of the few remaining places in Lawrence with a physical connection to Langston Hughes, and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Extensive renovations have taken place in recent years, and are nearing completion. Work has stabilized the building, its brick walls and towers, created an accessible entrance on Ninth Street, repaired the windows, including the stained-glass windows, repaired the wooden louvers on the towers and more. Many generous partners have collaborated to make the project possible through their work and donations, including the Lawrence Preservation Alliance, architect Stan Hernly, the Shelley Miller Charitable Trust, Jeff and Mary Weinberg, the Kansas Heritage Trust Fund, Douglas County Heritage Conservation Council, and church trustees.

## Holiday Adopt a Family 2021, Non-Food Drive, Merch Sale

can always email Lane.


### **Marathon Route**

## **Safe Winter Walkways**

We are accepting volunteers for Safe Winter Walkways for the 2021-2022 winter season!

### Preparing snow routes for pedestrian traffic

The Safe Winter Walkways Program is an excellent resource for members of our community who are physically unable to keep their sidewalks clear during snow events. The goal is to create safer and more accessible pedestrian walkways, and it is a structured version of what already happens in many neighborhoods – neighbors helping neighbors.

Lawrence residents with a passion for helping others and who enjoy winter weather (and shoveling snow) are needed to volunteer for the Safe Winter Walkways Program. Volunteers are matched with residents needing assistance, and the program makes every effort to match volunteers with residents in their neighborhoods. All volunteers are asked to commit to the entire snow season and be willing to shovel after each winter weather event. Volunteers are not required to provide snow removal for private driveways, sidewalks or walkways, but they may choose to also clear those areas.

The Safe Winter Walkways is a program provided by the City of Lawrence and the Senior Resource Center for Douglas County.




