Juanita and Jesse

You may have heard, our dear neighbors, Juanita and Jesse Hernandez, of the 900 block of New Jersey, passed away January 25th, 2018, within hours of each other.

Juanita Romero Hernandez, often called Jenny, was born here in Lawrence in 1927. She was the oldest of 13 children and a devoted member of the St John's church.

Board member Judy Romero remembers Juanita as one of her mother's friends, "when mom moved to Lawrence from Williamstown [in the] 8th grade. They worked together at Hercules Ammunition Plant during the war. Surely they were at least 18 then. Mrs. Hernandez lived all her life in East Lawrence, on New Jersey St across from New York School."

Jesse N. Hernandez was born in Topeka in 1927. He worked for Santa Fe Railroad, then worked for USD 497 for 37 years, until his retirement. Jesse was custodian at New York School for many years.

Jesse and Juanita were married in 1945. They were married for 72 years and had five children together.

Juanita's sister, Becky, shares this memory:

"Juanita and Jesse Hernandez loved living on the East side of Lawrence. They lived on the east side 64 years. Fifteen years ago, their house needed many repairs done and they felt it was best to move on rather than try to remodel. They looked all over Lawrence looking for a good location, but their heart kept coming back to the East side. From their window at 910 New Jersey, they could see the children playing at New York School and they could walk in 10 minutes to downtown Lawrence to see all the parades and shop. They just felt comfortable living there. They then decided they could never leave, so bulldozed their beloved house down (they didn't look) and built their new home right there. They enjoyed 14 years living in their newer home. They had great neighbors, Eloise Davis, Don Kantorv and June Floyd and many other great neighbors as well. The neighbors on the block looked out for them, putting their newspaper on the porch, shoveling their sidewalk, checking in them, and they loved that."

Neighbor Don Kantorv has these few apt words to share about Mr and Mrs Hernandez, "I lived four months short of 30 years two doors south of Jesse and Jenny, and thus knew them well. They were two of the best people that I have ever known. I felt honored to be asked by them to sign their will as a witness."

Rest well, Jesse and Jenny. You will be missed.

LPA Information

The Lawrence Preservation Alliance recently published "Your Guide to Owning a Historic Home in Lawrence," a brochure full of basic information, tips and useful links for those owning historic homes. It contains a wealth of information for properly caring for and learning more about a historic property. Here are some excerpts:

What Do I Need to Know About Caring for a Historic Home?

Owning a historic home can be a bit like being the curator of an antique. Ownership brings responsibilities to preserve and protect a home's value. There are resources you can use to help you with maintenance or alterations you seek without harming the things that give your home its historic value. For larger projects, following the guidelines can mean rehabilitation tax credits for your project.

What Does "Historic" Mean?

Many existing structures could be considered historic, but thorough documentation is needed to be designated in registers of historic places. In Lawrence, it is possible to be listed on three different registers as an individual structure or as part of a historic district:

- Lawrence Register of Historic Places
- Register of Historic Kansas Places
- National Register of Historic Places

How Does Historic Designation Affect What I Can Do With My Property?

There is no historic review for any general maintenance or building activity that does not require a permit. If you apply for a permit, your plans will be reviewed by local officials to ensure that the changes you seek will not remove or damage defining characteristics that make your property significant.

How Does Historic Review Work?

Building or repair projects that require a permit will undergo some type of review by the Planning Office when they impact a property that has a historic designation, are within a historic district, or are located near a listed property.

If you file for a demolition permit, there is a 30-day waiting period for the permit, regardless of your location. For building permits, city Planning Staff will check to see if your project impacts a property that has received historic designation. If it does, your plans will be forwarded to the Historic Resources Administrator. Most projects pass review administratively. Larger projects are reviewed by the Historic Resources Commission (HRC), which conducts monthly hearings for projects impacting properties listed on our state and national registers, as well as our local register.


