

Do you feel you could speak for neighbors who are underrepresented in City processes and social mechanisms? Unlike some boards, the ELNA board does not require a monetary investment in the organization, all we want is your time and effort. ELNA board members are required to attend monthly meetings and are encouraged to champion projects and lend a hand in regular events and fundraising activities.

Our annual Board of Directors election and all member meeting is coming up on Monday November 8th, 2021. If you think you'd like to run for a position on the ELNA Board, you must attend our October meeting, Monday October 11th and declare your intention to run.

At this time, we aren't sure if we'll meet via zoom or in person. Watch our website for details as they are decided.

As always, only in-neighborhood individual (not business or nonprofit or out-of-neighborhood associate) members are eligible to vote for the ELNA board. All Board members must be voting eligible. Officers of the Board (President, Vice President, and Secretary) must have been board members for at least ninety days.

Planners to Consider Accessory Dwelling Units

City zoning codes already provide for accessory dwelling units (ADUs) in single family zoning districts across the city. ADUs can be an extra attached or detached apartment in addition to the main dwelling. Currently, ADUs are not permitted in the RS-5 zone, the primary zoning classification for much of East Lawrence. The City Planning Staff has been instructed to draft a text amendment to allow ADUs in the RS-5 zone. ELNA has invited Sandra Day from the City Staff to our September ELNA meeting to explain the issue and listen to concerns that East Lawrence residents might have. This will be our first opportunity to comment on the issue, not the last. ELNA will provide periodic updates as the discussion continues.

Wishing Bench Will Rise From Ashes

You have very likely heard about the tragic burning of our Wishing Bench over the weekend of August 15th, 2021. The fire is still under investigation, but plans for repairs are underway

First, a little history:

Some documents hint that the Bench began its life in 2007 as a KU student project with ties to Hurricane Katrina recovery. It is also said that the object that would become the Wishing Bench just appeared one day near 9th and Delaware somewhere around 2010. Previous articles about our beautiful Wishing Bench posit that she emerged from the River, fully formed and self-possessed like the Venus on her half shell, her pylons

glistening with the waters of the muddy Kaw. (Wishing Bench fans can decide which origin story to believe.) We know for sure that KT Walsh hand painted the "Make a Wish" sign, and the Bench became the improvised, funky, fragile, unique pub-

lic work of art we love. Ownership is a difficult term to apply to a Bench Who Belongs to Herself, to a place of hope and contemplation that belongs to Everyone, but, ELNA assumed the role of "owner" in 2017 when neighbors let ELNA know that the Wishing Bench base was unsafe, and required repair. At

that time, ELNA raised money and engaged Struct Re-Struct to rebuild the damaged base. The safer and improved

Wishing Bench base was in place by May of 2018. The Wishing Bench starred in a film by Marlo Angell in 2020! In addition to the numerous daily wishers and decorators, the Wishing Bench has had many guardians and caretakers over the years, most notably neighbor and





local artist Catherine Reed who lovingly attended to it before she passed away this May.

As "owner", ELNA's Board has approved a plan for helping our Wishing Bench rise from the ashes. ELNA deeply appreciates many generous offers of help and money from the community, including one from the NR Hamm Company's Community Service Team which recently opened an office around the corner from the Wishing Bench on Pennsylvania Street. The Hamm's folks are able to help us repair the Bench quickly at its

current location in a basic manner -- repair the deck which burned, get a new roof on to replace the burned fiberglass roof, clean some of the soot off the frame and make it accessible.

There will be no major changes to the character and context of the Wishing Bench. We will not be making the metal frame look all shiny and new. The fire is now part of the Wishing Bench's story. Eventually, the Wishing Bench will need to be moved from its current site. The Flint Hills Holdings group, owner of the location, has plans to develop the land in the next 2-5 years. Since we are having an extensive review / re-do of our Neighborhood Plan next year, we

the Plan, and can decide on good locations for a new home within that larger context, after extensive community engagement. In the meantime, the Wishing Bench will be able to continue its role as a canvas for grassroots community artistic expression on a safe and accessible platform. The best news is, all signs point to the Wishing Bench repair work being done before our Block Party on September 25th! A rededication / celebration for our Bench, beginning at 4pm at the Bench, is in the works!



New Water Line Being Planned

The City of Lawrence reached out to ELNA to inform us that plans are being made to build a new water line in East Lawrence in 2022. A main water line that runs along New York Street from 8th Street to 15th Street is nearing the end of its useful life and needs to be replaced. The City is currently considering four alternatives for the new line. One alternative would replace the line where it currently exists in the easement adjacent to New York Street. Two alternatives would run the new water line below the street right of way on either New York Street or New Jersey Street. The final alternative would run underneath parts of both streets, connected beneath a numbered street. The City plans to hold a public meeting in late September or early October to present the alternatives and receive comments from neighbors. The City will be sending post cards to every property along New York and New Jersey Streets that could be affected by the project to announce the time and place of any meetings. ELNA will advocate for the protection of historic resources such as brick streets and sidewalks, where ever the project goes, and for robust opportunities for public discussion.
