

Currently, we are closely monitoring proposed changes to the Lawrence Land Development Code, the proposed policy for Brick Streets and Sidewalks, the site selection for Lawrence's downtown bus station, demolitions of historic buildings and maintenance of our neighborhood parks. We have advocated successfully for decades to keep our schools open!

Art in the Park is a juried fine art and fine craft event held in beautiful shade-filled South Park (12th and Massachusetts) on the south end of vibrant downtown Lawrence, Kansas.

125 artists booths, 14 Bands and a wide variety of sweet and savory food trucks will be set up for this two day event!

Art in the Park is a Lawrence tradition dating back to 1964 and is the Lawrence Art Guild's premier fundraising event. Winning "Best Event" since 2019 as voted by the public in the "Best of Lawrence" contest, Art in the Park is a Lawrence favorite. 2024 will be our fourth year as a two day event with over 20,000 visitors expected. Fifteen musical groups create beautiful background music (keeping in mind volume for artists), and food vendors provide a wide variety of sweet and savory options.



# "Finding La Yarda" Exhibit at Lawrence Arts Center

The "Finding La Yarda" exhibit opened August 9th at the Lawrence Arts Center, 940 New Hampshire. and will run through September 21.

This immersive exhibition recreates a room from the Mexican American housing units of La Yarda which housed railroad workers between 1920-51. The artistic render is based on architectural design by Brenna Buchanan Young and set construction by Jeremy Rockwell. A wall length mural by Justin Favela and 3D elements such as a tree, garden and flowers create an impressionistic landscape for attendees to explore. Ceramic pieces by Jonathan Christensen Caballero isolate special memories from the residents created from casted moldings of family members' hands, feet and faces. Photographic portraits of La Yarda residents by Ann Dean will be installed on the intersection of 8th & Delaware on the Lawrence Loop.

Are you interested in volunteering to serve on the ELNA Board? Are there issues in the neighborhood you'd like to see addressed? Do you feel you could speak for neighbors who are underrepresented in City processes and social mechanisms? Unlike some boards, the ELNA board does not require a monetary investment in the organization, all we want is your time and effort. ELNA board members are required to attend monthly meetings and are encouraged to champion projects and lend a hand in regular events and fundraising activities.

Our annual Board of Directors election and all member meeting is coming up on Monday November 11th, 2024. If you think you'd like to run for a position on the ELNA Board, you must attend our October meeting, Monday October 14th, and declare your intention to run.

Only neighborhood resident or property owner individual members (not business or non-profit or out-of-neighborhood associate members) are eligible to run or vote for the ELNA board. ## What's a Nostalgia Room?

Lane sat down with Emily Kate of The Nostalgia Room (412 E 9th, you know, next to Marty's Do's Deluxe) in mid July, to ask that very question. Here's a rough transcript of their conversation.

You look familiar. Where do I know you from, Emily Kate?

Emily Kate is from here, from Lawrence, and went to art school in Boston. She's worked at many places in Downtown Lawrence's service industry – bartending and serving at La Prima Tazza, The Pig and Second Chance and more.

So, what is The Nostalgia Room?

A unique bar without the alcohol. A place to be socially sober. A thriving community. Like Cheers, but without the booze. An option for young people. Drinking culture is a problem. A social problem, an addiction, a poison. Nostalgia Room is a place for harm reduction, consent, and boundaries. It's a healthy service industry and a way to raise awareness of sobriety as an option.

How long has The Nostalgia Room been here?

About year in this location. The Nostalgia Room was a dry bar in Repetition Coffee, just another block east on the other side of 9th. There we built a community and tested concept with sustainable, incremental growth. We were in that location for one year.

What was this space, 412 E 9th, in the past?

In the past, recent and distant, it was mostly commercial space. A grocery store, a farm supply store, etc.

How many employees are at The Nostalgia Room? Just four! Emily Kate, Becca, Cody, and Brooke What does The Nostalgia Room serve?

Coffee, sourced from Repetition Coffee – everything from espresso to cappuccino. Teas – chai tea, matcha latte, black, green, and herbal tea blends from Firebelly teas. Seasonal and housemade sodas. Plus non-alcoholic cocktails, non-alcoholic beer and wine.

Most ingredients in our cocktails are made in house and hand-crafted. We also have a bottle shop. If you like a cocktail, take a bottle home! We don't have food just yet, but we're working on getting a local source. We have plenty of seating and wifi. You could have a meeting here. Bring your kids. We have playthings. We do catering! We'd love to collaborate with your organization, do a pop up, provide drinks for a party, or dry bar at a wedding.

Hours?

Closed Monday and Tuesday. Open 8am to 2pm Wednesday, Thursday and Sunday. Open Friday and Saturday 8am to 9pm.

Is there anything you want neighbors to know?

We are not an ornament. We bring value. A place where people feel safe and can just be.

But those places don't exist for free. We're invested. If you've thought about coming, do. Make us part of your routine.

Because of our focus on public policies that affect East Lawrence, ELNA recognizes that elections at all levels and at all times can be consequential. As a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, we do not endorse candidates for public office. However, we strongly encourage neighborhood residents to register, educate themselves about the candidates and issues, and to cast a well-informed vote. See the article in this newsletter for more information about the November election.

Flying under the radar is a ballot measure this November that would change the structure of Lawrence's City Commission. There have been loud rumblings of discontent with local governments at recent meetings and in social media, with calls for changes. This ballot measure may or may not produce the kind of changes that are needed. I encourage a full vetting and community discussions of the proposal to assure it would make things better and not worse.

## EAST LAWRENCE VOTES!

East Lawrence voters will help elect a new President and Vice-President. There are contested races for US Congress, State Senator, State Board of Education, Douglas County District Attorney and Douglas County Commissioner. There is also a ballot question that would change the makeup of the City Commission and directly elect Lawrence's Mayor.

East Lawrence Neighborhood Association, as an organization **never** endorses any candidate nor takes positions on any ballot measure. BUT we do strongly encourage you to vote, and we will help to make sure you have all the information you need to do so. **YOUR VOTE MATTERS! PLEASE REGISTER and VOTE!** 

#### First, Make Sure You're Registered to Vote

- If you're not sure if you're registered, or uncertain if your registration information is correct, you may check on the Douglas County Clerk's website: https://www.dgcoks.gov/depts/voting-and-elections/your-voter-information. You may also check your status in person at the Douglas County Election office at 711 W 23rd St. (23rd & Louisiana).
- The last day to register to be eligible to vote in the Election is Tuesday October 16th.
- If you know you're not registered, but you want to be, you can do so online through the State of Kansas website at: https://sos.ks.gov/elections/voter-registration.html. You can check your voting eligibility and fill in an online registration through that portal. The Douglas County Election office at 23rd and Louisiana can help you register as well. Be sure to have your ID documents in order before you register.

#### Then, Vote!

#### By Mail-In Ballot

- You may request a mail in ballot at https://www.ksvotes.org/. A separate application must be submitted for each election, except in the case of permanent illness or disability.
- Your completed application must be received at the Election Office by the Tuesday October 29th. Submit your application much earlier to avoid mail delays!
- Ballots will be mailed to you beginning 20 days before the election.

#### **Advance Voting**

- Advance voting, both in person and by mail in ballot, for the Election begins On Wednesday October 16th.
- You can return your mail-in ballot by mail or put it in a secure ballot drop box. Ballot Drop Boxes are located at these places around the City:

Douglas County Courthouse, 1100 Massachusetts Street, Lawrence Douglas County Election Office, 711 W. 23rd Street, Lawrence

Douglas County Treasurer Satellite Office, 2000 W. 31st Street, Lawrence

• You can advance vote in person at the Douglas County Election Office, 711 W. 23rd St. Hours are: Weekdays, October 16 to October 25, 8 am to 6 pm; October 28 to November 1, 8 am to 7 pm. Saturdays, October 6 & November 2, 9 am to 3 pm. Monday November 4, 8 am to Noon.

#### **Election Day!**

- The General Election will be held on Tuesday November 6th. If you didn't advance vote or utilize a mail-in ballot, you can vote at your polling place. Polls are open 7am to 7pm.
- Precinct 39 is the area east of Mass and north of 11th. Precinct 39 votes at the Cider Gallery, 810 Pennsylvania. Precinct 40 is the area between 11<sup>th</sup> and 15th, east of Mass and west of Burroughs Creek Trail. Precinct 40 votes at Trinity Lutheran Church, 1245 New Hampshire Street. You must vote at your designated precinct polling place.

Lawrence City Ballot Question: to change the method of electing City Commissioners and directly elect a Mayor, increasing the size of the governing body from 5 to 7. Yes or No.

#### What to Bring?

Be sure to bring your photo identification with you to your polling place when voting in person. In Kansas, a valid photo ID can be a driver's license or non-driver ID issued by the State of Kansas, a conceal carry license issued by the State of Kansas, a United States passport, an employee badge or ID document issued by a municipal, county, state or federal government office, a military ID issued by the United States, a student ID card issued by an accredited postsecondary institution of education in the State of Kansas, a public assistance identification card issued by a municipal, county, state or federal government office, an ID card issued by an Indian tribe. Persons aged 65 years or older may use expired photo ID documents.

#### **Important Dates to Remember:**

General Election Dates

- October 15, 2024: Last day to register to vote in the General Election
- October 16, 2024: Advance voting begins; advance ballots by mail will be sent to voters
- October 29, 2024: Deadline to request an advance ballot for mail
- November 5, 2024: Advance in person voting closes at noon
- November 6, 2024: General Election, 7am to 7pm. You must vote at precinct location.

#### For more info:

The Douglas County Clerk's office is a great resource for everything you need to know to vote. At the Clerk's office website, you can register to vote, find your polling place, explore other ways to vote such as mail in and advance ballots, see who will be on your ballot, view your own voting history, and even link to each candidate's information. The clerk also has financial disclosure reports, so you can find out who is funding some candidates' campaigns. ## Remembering Dave Evans

I am sorry to report that I have learned that Dave Evans died in July. He was 69. I first met Dave in the late 70's when we played softball together at Hobbs Park. He was kind of a quiet guy with a quirky sense of humor, played hard and was a great teammate. In recent years, I found Dave to have these same qualities as a historical researcher. Many of the homes on historic registers in East Lawrence are there because of Dave's many hours of digging through primary sources and artifacts for info to add to the narrative and create the tapestry. Dave worked tirelessly with Dennis Domer on my house, finding more than could possibly ever be used in one nomination. He was an occasional contributor to the East Lawrence News and was a true champion for preserving our neighborhood and telling our stories. Those of us who knew Dave know what a treasure we've lost, and those of you who didn't, I am sorry you never had the chance to spend a fun evening with him sharing juicy tidbits of East Lawrence history.
